Farmfair abides by and supports the regulations outlined in the Canada Health and Animals Act, the Province of Alberta Protection Act and the Canadian Association of Exhibitors Livestock Security and Safety Manual.

Rules and Regulations

1. All entries are subject to the General Rules and Regulations of Farmfair. Please refer to these rules and regulations and read them carefully.
2. Dress code (will apply to all teamsters and hookers): western headwear, footwear and long sleeved western styled shirts (matching shirts are preferred).
3. Harness must be well maintained with no inappropriate additions such as wire or binder twine.
4. Exhibitors are requested to decorate their stall and keep the stalls and stabling area clean.
5. Teams must be on site for weigh-in, according to schedule presented. Any equipment present on the horse at the time of weigh-in, (or not present) must be present (or not present) when the horse competes (ex. Horseshoes or cleats).





6. All teams must comply with 0 sponsorship branding.
7. Minimum team weight is 2.400 pounds.
8. No cross-weight entries will be allowed. No horse may compete in two divisions.
9. An initial start weight of 4000 lbs will start the competition for lightweights and middleweights. 5000 lbs for heavy weights. A 1000 lb weight increase will occur for all weight classes until 50% of the field are left in competition. From that point, 500 lbs will be added until the last puller in each weight class is determined.
10. Teams will have 1:30 minutes to hook the boat, a team's time will begin as soon as our name is called to start. Should you not comply with this, you will be disqualified from the competition.
11. Boundary lines are 16 feet apart. Length of a full pull is 14 feet. Competitors are allowed two tries to complete the pull.
12. Teams must stay between the boundary lines while hooked to the boat. If a horse steps over or under the lines, the team will be asked to unhook and will be credited with the previous completed pull. If a horse steps on the line, during the first pull of starting weight, the team will return at the end of the round to pull again.
13. If the boat is too close to a line, the teamster may ask the judge to waive the line; this will be at the judge's discretion.
14. The driver or hooker has the option of riding on the boat or walking.
15. Only the teamster and hooker are allowed in the pulling lane during the competition. Headers are optional but only by the hooker.
16. Teamsters are not to start in manner considered to be abusive to the horses. If an aggressive start (jerk, slam, etc.), first time will be a warning, second time will be a disqualification. This will be at the Judge's discretion. Any warnings or disqualifications will be announced by the announcer.
17. A try is 6" or an accumulation to get 6". When horses are commanded to go and do not move that boat that is considered a try.
18. If equipment breaks during a pull, or horses step over the line during the break, they are allowed another try at the end of the round.
19. Slapping or rippling of the lines while hooked to the boat will not be permitted. Drivers will be asked to unhook and will be credited with the previous pull.
20. Teams must be under control at all times.
21. Horses must not be left unattended at any time during the show.
22. Abuse of, or tampering with, horses by teamster or assistants before, during or after the show will result in immediate disqualification, forfeit of prizes, and charges applied where appropriate.





23. Drug testing – The show management reserves the right to conduct blood and/ or urine analysis tests to determine the presence or absence of performance enhancing substances on each horse in the pulling team. As well, any competitor wishing to challenge the performance of a team or individual horse can do so by completing the Performance Appeal form. Upon submission of a completed Performance Appeal form to Farmfair Show Management, the horse(s) in question will undergo blood and/or urine analysis tests to determine the presence or absence of performance enhancing substances. Positive test results will result in the Teamster forfeiting all winnings. The team, teamster, and owners will be suspended from future draft horse pull competitions at Farmfair International for a period of time as determined by show management, and the information will be forwarded to the North American Livestock Show & Rodeo Manager's Association Rule Infraction Database. The Teamster in question will also be required to cover the full expense of the veterinarian services involved with performing the tests. A negative test will result in the Teamster who submitted the Performance Appeal being required to cover the full expense of the veterinarian services involved in performing the tests.
24. The show management reserves the right to drug test any team. Positive tests will result in the Teamster forfeiting all winnings and will be required to cover the full expense of the veterinarian services involved with performing the tests. The Team, Teamster, and owners will be suspended from future draft horse pull competitions at Farmfair International for a period of time as determined by the show management, and the information will be forwarded to the North American Livestock Show & Rodeo manager's Association Database.
25. If the team is disqualified for any infraction, they will be credited with their last completed pull.
26. The winner will be determined by the most inches (distance) pulled with "pounds over inches" being calculated before each team pulls in each class.
27. The Farmfair Heavy Horse Pull Committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules to make necessary corrections.
28. The Judge's decision is final. Any competitor that argues with the Judge will be immediately disqualified, asked to leave the ring and all monies will be forfeited. A protest may be filed in writing to show management within 24 hours of the holding of the event and must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.
29. Farmfair Bio-Security Rule 7.7 – Livestock Release Form. If an animal becomes ill during its stay at Farmfair, they MUST be examined by a veterinarian before leaving the premises and be deemed fit to do so. All exhibitors will be required to fill out and sign a Livestock Release Form when removing livestock from the premises, healthy or otherwise, which must be signed by an official vet or chose representative of Farmfair.
